PLATTSMOUTH CITY COUNCIL November 19, 2012

A meeting of the City Council of the City of Plattsmouth, Nebraska was convened in open and public session at 7:00 o'clock p.m. on November 19, 2012 at City Hall in Plattsmouth Nebraska. Present were Mayor Michael C. Bowman and Council Members: Terry Kerns, John R. Porter, Jeanie Brookhouser, Terry D. Tilson, Steve Riese, Pat Dugan, Art Tesarek and Doug Derby. Council Members Absent: None. Also present: City Administrator Ervin Portis, City Clerk Sandra J. Meyer, City Attorney Roger Johnson and City Treasurer Peggy Wilsey.

Notice of this meeting was given in advance by publication in the Plattsmouth Journal. Proof of publication along with the Mayor and Council's Acknowledgment of Receipt of Notice are on file. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the public.

The Mayor publicly stated to all in attendance that a current copy of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act and a copy of all documents being discussed at the meeting were available for inspection and indicated the location of such copies in the room where the meeting was being held.

ITEM 5-CITIZEN DELEGATION

Geri Byrk, 503 School Road, Plattsmouth spoke in favor of the Historic Guidelines.

Rich McKinley, 201 Avenue A, Plattsmouth-Chairman of the Historic Preservation Board gave a brief review of the 7 year process to get to this point and stated that the Board feels that adoption of an ordinance designating a Historic District would help secure and maintain the integrity of Main Street.

Jennifer Jensen, 14372 Penny Drive, Plattsmouth-co-owner of DC's Waterhole, 441 Main Street, Plattsmouth asked the council to consider amending the City's current ordinance which regulates the sale of alcohol on Sundays to align with the state statute which was revised in July 2012. LB 681 allows the sale of distilled liquor between 6:00 a.m. and noon on Sundays and Jensen feels that both package and on-sale businesses would benefit from the change. With the completion of the Main Street project there has been in increase in visitors to Main Street and this requested change would allow businesses to serve the customer's drink of choice prior to noon on Sundays.

Jennifer Jensen also stated the DC's Waterhole and other Main Street businesses will again be sponsoring Play'n It Safe-Free Ride Home on New Year's Eve-this is the 3rd year.

Charles Jones, Executive Director Plattsmouth Main Street Association stated that flags are flying at 6th and Main in honor of the 4 killed at the Embassy. Jones then made reference to the Historic District Petition Drive and its success. There are 76 primary business entrances in the District and just this year 31 have made improvements and there are 12 pending applications.
