This is a FEMA reimbursable project. Motion by Forrest seconded by Riese to approve the Third-Party Consultant Special Inspection and Materials Testing Agreement (2019 Flood Recovery Project PW#88688-Relocated Wastewater Treatment Plant) with Terracon and authorize the Mayor to execute the agreement between owner and contractor for Third Party Consultant Special Inspection and Materials Testing in an amount not to exceed \$192,775.00. ITEM 8 B

Emily Bausch, City Administrator informed Mayor and Council she received the insurance required and after review all coverages are satisfactory. No contingency is needed for approval and the coverage meets BNSF requirements. Motion by Brookhouser seconded by Clark to approve construction contract to Valley Corporation for the New Wastewater Treatment Plant Contract No. 3 (2019 Flood Recovery Project PW#88688-Relocated Wastewater Treatment Plant) and authorize the Mayor to execute the agreement between owner and contractor for construction contract (stipulated price) in the amount of \$17,581,944.49. Following further discussion, ROLL CALL: Yes-Graham, Riese, Kerns, Minahan, Forrest, Brookhouser, Clark and Muller. No-None. Absent-None. Abstain-None. MOTION CARRIED.

ITEM 8 C

Emily Bausch, City Administrator stated this project is in conjunction with the Force Main project which is a FEMA reimbursable project. This is not a FEMA reimbursable project but makes sense to do together so Lincoln Avenue is only disturbed once. Insurance certificates have been received and reviewed and are satisfactory. Motion by Muller seconded by Forrest to approve construction contract to Valley Corporation for the Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation—Lincoln Avenue Project and authorize the Mayor to execute the agreement between owner and contractor for construction contract (stipulated price) in the amount of \$683,459.83. ROLL CALL: Yes-Minahan, Graham, Brookhouser, Kerns, Riese, Muller, Forrest and Clark. No-None. Absent-None. Abstain-None. MOTION CARRIED.

ITEM 8 D

Steve Perry, PE-Olmsted & Perry Consulting Engineers Inc. stated this is a progress payment through June. The Pay App was reviewed and Mr. Perry recommended approval. Motion by Forrest seconded by Riese to approve Application for Payment No. 2 from Hawkins Construction Co. for the New Wastewater Treatment Plant Contract No. 2 (2019 Flood Recovery Project PW#88688-Relocated Wastewater Treatment Plant) in the amount of \$1,119,732.30 and authorize the Mayor to execute Application for Payment No. 2. ROLL CALL: Yes-Forrest, Brookhouser, Riese, Graham, Muller, Clark, Kerns and Minahan. No-None. Absent-None. Abstain-None. MOTION CARRIED.

Council member Kerns stated he would be abstaining from any discussion or action on ITEM 8 E and ITEM 8 F as he has a conflict of interest.

Steve Perry, PE-Olmsted & Perry Consulting Engineers Inc. reviewed Application for Payment No. 1 submitted by Kerns Excavation Co. The work is complete with final water quality testing remaining. Mr. Perry recommended approval of Application for Payment No. 1. Motion by Forrest seconded by Riese to approve Application for Payment No. 1 from Kerns Excavation Co. Inc. for the Highway 75 Utilities Relocation -Westside Drive Water Main in the amount of \$49,218.55 and authorize the Mayor to execute Application for Payment No. 1. ROLL CALL: Yes-Muller, Clark, Brookhouser, Forrest. Minahan, Riese and Graham. No-None. Absent-None. Abstain-Kerns. MOTION CARRIED.

ITEM 8 F

Steve Perry, PE-Olmsted & Perry Consulting Engineers Inc. reviewed the request for Change Order No. 1. The change order is for a five week time extension due to a delay in the production and delivery of the precast manholes. The substantial and final completion would be extended to August 15, 2023. Mr. Perry recommended approval. Motion by Riese seconded by Forrest to approve Change Order No. 1 for the Ave A and 8th Street South Sanitary Sewer Project for a contract time extension and authorize the Mayor to execute Change Order No. 1. ROLL CALL: Yes-Clark, Minahan, Riese, Brookhouser, Forrest, Muller and Graham. No-None. Absent-None. Abstain-Kerns. MOTION CARRIED.

ITEM 9 - NEW BUSINESS

ITEM 9 A

Emily Bausch, City Administrator gave background regarding the Preliminary Plat for Club View Acres, the Planning Commission recommendations and the requested waivers by the developer. Fire Mitigation Plan options were reviewed and Title 124 requirements were discussed. Large scale plats were available for review.

Pursuant to publication Mayor Lambert opened a public hearing at 7:37 p.m. to hear and consider public comments regarding a preliminary plat of a major subdivision of property located west of the intersection of Club View Drive and Highway 75, legally described as 17600 Club View Drive; 11-12-13 LOTS 31 & 32 EXC HWY SE1/4 NE1/4 (23.59) and 11-12-13 LOT 28 N1/2 SW1/4 NE1/4 (20). Parcel Id Number are 130162523 and 130162795.

Trevor Veskrna-TD2 (representing the developer)-Seeking approval of the proposed Preliminary Plat for Club View Acres and briefly addressed specifics of the subdivision. Mr. Veskrna stated he was available to answer any questions.

Bob Felthousen, 17810 Hwy 75-Questioned if the city was going to approve mobile or modular homes within this development-if they do, it would make the value go down on surrounding property. Who would be responsible for natural gas to this development?

Todd Schuler, 17314 Club View Drive-Voiced concern regarding the septic systems-would they be governed by county requirements? Asked if there was a plan if Club View Drive to Hwy 75 was not an option for access. Questioned the green space/park. Also questioned if modular homes would be allowed and the minimum size requirements for homes within this development.

Tim Macrander, 624 Nicholas Road-Referenced the number of waivers requested by the developer. Residents get no vote on the representatives (property is within the 2 mile extraterritorial jurisdiction of the city and the residents are county) making decisions on this proposed development.

Dave Stuart, 17904 Hwy 75-The intersection of Club View Drive and Hwy 75 is very dangerous, especially during the rush hour times. Concerned the City approves the proposed development but the residents in the area deal with the county. Feels county and state need to have more input.

Gordon Schull, 18001 6th Street-Lives on 6th Street just north of the project and he already has low water pressure so what is the addition of 22 more homes going to do to his water pressure. Stated Windstream (internet) is terrible-there will need to be some upgrades.

Karen Stiles, 17404 Clubview Drive-Voiced concerns about the intersection of Club View Drive and Hwy 75 and how dangerous it is.

Trevor Veskrna, TD2 addressed some of the questions from speakers at the public hearing. Regarding mobile/modular homes being allowed-an HOA (Home Owners Association) will dictate what is allowed. The developer pays for placement of utilities in the development: Rural Water and Natural Gas. Septic-minimum lot size is 1.25 acres. Perc tests have been done. Fire Protections-there are no fire hydrants. Establishing public park-allow for cash payment. A traffic study has been done and submitted to the NDOT-there are 22 lots and per Mr. Veskrna, the state indicated they are not concerned. The Rural Water district supplying water to this development will install a new 8 inch main at the site.

Mayor Lambert again stated the reason for the public hearing and with no one else coming forward to speak, closed the public hearing at 8:02 p.m.

ITEM 9 B

Council members voiced concerns regarding: Safety at the intersection of Club View Drive and Hwy 75; Septic vs. private wastewater system and by allowing would we be boxing in areas for potential growth of the city; 3 options for Fire Mitigation Plans-1. Tanker in, 2. Subterrainian Bunkers, and 3. Home Fire Suppression system which would have to be on a separate tap than the home so each property would require 2 taps and this would have to be approved by the Rural Water District. Motion by Minahan to adopt RESOLUTION NO. 23-004: A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE THE PRELIMINARY PLAT OF LOTS 1-22, CLUB VIEW ACRES, A MAJOR SUBDIVISION, LOCATED IN SECTION 11, TOWNSHIP 12 NORTH, RANGE 13 EAST OF THE 6th P.M., CASS COUNTY, NEBRASKA, AND GENERALLY LOCATED WEST OF THE INTERSECTION OF CLUB VIEW DRIVE AND HIGHWAY 75. Due to lack of a second, said motion died.

Stephen Q. Preston, City Attorney informed council the resolution before them lists the waivers and requirements recommended by the Planning Commission and any of the items can be removed, changed or other items can be added when making a motion. Following discussion, Motion by Brookhouser seconded by Forrest to postpone consideration of RESOLUTION NO. 23-004: A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE THE PRELIMINARY PLAT OF LOTS 1-22, CLUB VIEW ACRES, A MAJOR SUBDIVISION, LOCATED IN SECTION 11, TOWNSHIP 12 NORTH, RANGE 13 EAST OF THE 6th P.M., CASS COUNTY, NEBRASKA, AND GENERALLY LOCATED WEST OF THE INTERSECTION OF CLUB VIEW DRIVE AND HIGHWAY 75 until the August 21, 2023 regular City Council meeting so staff can do additional study/review of: Traffic; Septic/Sanitary Sewer; County input; and fire suppression. Following further discussion, ROLL CALL: Yes-Graham, Muller, Kerns, Forrest, Clark, Minahan, Riese and Brookhouser. No-None. Absent-None. Abstain-None. MOTION CARRIED.

ITEM 9 C

Pursuant to publication Mayor Lambert opened a public hearing at 8:35 p.m. to hear and consider public comments regarding a change to the Plattsmouth Land Development Ordinance Article 7-2 B 6c "accessory buildings". Emily Bausch, City Administrator reviewed the change request and the memorandum submitted by Adam Denio, Building and Zoning Administrator. No one else spoke. Mayor Lambert again stated the reason for the public hearing and with no one else coming forward to speak, closed the public hearing at 8:39 p.m.

Motion by Muller seconded by Minahan to approve first reading of ORDINANCE NO. 2006: AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 7-2 OF THE AUGUST 2006 LAND DEVELOPMENT ORDINANCE, FOR THE CITY OF PLATTSMOUTH, NEBRASKA, RELATED TO SETBACK ADJUSTMENTS, TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT; TO PROVIDE FOR PUBLICATION IN PAMPHLET FORM; AND TO PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE by title only. ROLL CALL: Yes-Brookhouser, Clark, Minahan, Riese, Muller, Forrest, Graham and Kerns. No-None. Absent-None. Abstain-None. MOTION CARRIED. Stephen Q. Preston, City Attorney read ORDINANCE NO. 2006 in to the record by title only.

ITEM 9 E

Council Member Kerns stated he would be abstaining from any discussion or action on this item as he is a potential bidder.

Nate Taylor, Public Works Director reviewed his request to authorize for design and construction phase services for 10 inch water main at North 5th Street and Avenue B. This would be done in conjunction with a leaking water valve and is above the \$50,000.00 bidding threshold. Motion by Brookhouser seconded by Riese to authorize design and construction phase services for 10 inch water main at North 5th Street and Avenue B. ROLL CALL: Yes-Clark, Riese, Brookhouser, Minahan, Graham, Forrest and Muller. No-None. Absent-None. Abstain-Kerns. MOTION CARRIED.

ITEM 9 F

Nate Taylor, Public Works Director reviewed his request for authorization to solicit Request for Proposals (RFP) for maintenance and services agreement for operations and management of the water and wastewater treatment plants. The city is a at critical point in staffing. This would be for the existing plants and current staff would be retained for field work and training on the new wastewater treatment plant through the construction phases. Motion by Brookhouser seconded by Muller to authorize the solicitation for Request for Proposals (RFP) for maintenance and services agreement for operations and management of the water and wastewater treatment facilities. ROLL CALL: Yes-Forrest, Minahan, Graham, Muller, Clark, Brookhouser, Kerns and Riese. No-None. Absent-None. Abstain-None. MOTION CARRIED.

ITEM 9 G

Emily Bausch, City Administrator informed council staff (City Administrator, City Attorney, Police Chief, Public Works Director and City Inspector) have met and discussed this issue. The Bellevue model is the preferred model to reach a resolution the city is looking for. Steve Rathman, Chief of Police reviewed the definition of motor vehicles. His preference is the Bellevue model but allow officer discretion. Whatever is passed, the police department staff will educate the public when in violation. Motion by Riese seconded by Brookhouser to receive Chief Rathman's memorandum regarding Non-motorized vehicles parked on city streets and direct staff to draft an ordinance using Bellevue language as a model. ROLL CALL: Yes-Brookhouser, Graham, Clark, Kerns, Minahan, Muller, Riese and Forrest. No-None. Absent-None. Abstain-None. MOTION CARRIED.
