ITEM 9 A

Council member Kerns stated that he would be abstaining from any discussion or action on this item as he has a conflict of interest, Kerns Excavating Co. is a subcontractor to Building Crafts Inc., the contracted company.

Steve Perry, Olmsted & Perry consulting Engineers Inc. stated that Payment No. 2 submitted by Building Crafts Inc. reflects 70% of the maximum ceiling for the contract and includes emergency recovery, restoration and protective service tasks associated with working towards restoring sewage treatment at the Wastewater Treatment Plant. Mr. Perry recommended approval for payment. Motion by Muller seconded by Wiemer to approve Contractor's Application for Payment No. 2 submitted by Building Crafts Inc. for Emergency Recovery and Protection Services at the City's Wastewater Treatment Facility in accordance with their contract in the amount of \$205,435.10 and authorize the Mayor to execute Pay Application No 2. ROLL CALL: Yes-Brookhouser, Wiemer, Muller, Grimshaw, Minahan, Derby and Riese. No-None. Absent-None. Abstain-Kerns. MOTION CARRIED.

Erv Portis, City Administrator and Steve Perry, City Engineer informed the Mayor and Council on the situation at each of the plants and the effects of the rising water. Wastewater Treatment Plant: Replaced the pumps at the raw sewage intake-no longer bypassing; due to the rising water the pumps were taken off-line and the temporary power equipment was pulled out (hopeful that Building Crafts will re-install in the next couple of days); DEQ has been very helpful-they want us to start sampling even though the samples will fail at this point; Clean-up from the rising water has caused additional expenses that have to be tracked; an Addendum to the Original Disaster Declaration was issued for the rising water. Water Treatment Plant: there is 5 feet of water over the road to the plant; it is still unknown who pays for the repair of the bank breach on the Platte River-there is no easy answer.

Day to day Perry and City staff are in contact (speak/meet). The next 30 days are unknown as far as water levels and projections
