September 8, 2026

A meeting of the City Council of the City of Plattsmouth, Nebraska was convened in open and public session at 7:00 o'clock p.m. on September 8, 2026 at Plattsmouth City Hall in Plattsmouth Nebraska. Emily Bausch, City Administrator, provided an update to Council on the property located at 522 & 526 Main St. The City has been working with consultants to determine the scale of magnitude and cost alternatives. Estimates were provided for Demolition, \$150K-\$250K, Remediate & Stabilize Existing Structure, \$250K+, and Renovate/Rebuild, \$1.3M+. Council inquired about using the City's nuisance abatement program to clean up the property. Emily stated abatement uses the least cost alternative and assesses the cost to the property. If Council wants to leave other options open besides demolition, the City will need to acquire the property. Motion by Muller seconded by Forrest to approve a Real Property Transfer Agreement between the City of Plattsburgh and William L. Tomson and Jill L. Tomson for 522 and 526 Main Street and authorize the Mayor to execute the Agreement. ROLL CALL: Yes-Kerns, Rollins, Muller, Riese, Forrest, Brookhouser, and Clark. No-None. Absent-Hardy. ITEM 10 A

Pursuant to publication, Mayor Lambert opened a public hearing at 7:25 p.m. to hear and consider public comment, oral or written, regarding the 2027-2032 One- and Six-Year Street Improvement Program for Plattsburgh and take action thereon. No one spoke in favor, opposition or of a neutral nature. Mayor Lambert again stated the reason for the public hearing and with no one coming forward, closed the public hearing at 7:26 p.m.

ITEM 10 B

Council member Forrest introduced a resolution numbered and titled as follows: **RESOLUTION 26-009: A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PLATTSMOUTH, CASS COUNTY, NEBRASKA TO APPROVE THE 2027-2032 ONE-AND SIX-YEAR STREET IMPROVEMENT PLAN FOR THE CITY OF PLATTSMOUTH, CASS COUNTY, NEBRASKA.** Emily Bausch, City Administrator, the process of establishing a 1-&-6-year street plan. The City works with a Class A street superintendent, contracted through Olsson, to review the City's large scale repair needs. City staff can complete minor and small-scale repair projects, but full-depth projects require different equipment and skill sets. These larger projects are eligible for state funding and must be on the plan. The proposed plan was presented to the Planning Commission for review and they have recommended approval. Changes from last year's plan include the removal of the completed Lincoln Ave. project and the addition of two collateral projects related to the Ave B. Water Main project. One of the new projects is eligible for partial FEMA funding. Shayne Huxoll, Olsson, was available to answer any questions. Motion by Forrest seconded by Riese to adopt RESOLUTION 26-009 by title only. ROLL CALL: Yes-Rollins, Muller, Riese, Forrest, Clark, Brookhouser, and Kerns. No-None. Absent-Hardy. Abstain-None. MOTION CARRIED. Damien Wright, City Attorney, read RESOLUTION 26-009 into the record by title only.

ITEM 10 C

Pursuant to publication, Mayor Lambert opened a public hearing at 7:39 p.m. to hear and consider public comment, oral or written, regarding a Special Use Permit for Contractor Bays / RV and Boat Storage located at 1538 S. 15th Street, Plattsmouth, NE 68048, legally described as PLATTSMOUTH - OUTLOTS LOT 24 & S86' SL2 OF 26 SW1/4 NE1/4 24-12-13 (2.70). No one spoke in favor, opposition or of a neutral nature. Mayor Lambert again stated the reason for the public hearing and with no one coming forward, closed the public hearing at 7:41 p.m.

ITEM 10 D

Council member Clark introduced a resolution numbered and titled as follows: **Resolution No. 26-010: A RESOLUTION TO GRANT A SPECIAL USE PERMIT TO DAVE EGAN, LOCATED AT 1538 S. 15TH STREET, PLATTSMOUTH NE, LEGALLY DESCRIBED AS PLATTSMOUTH – OUTLOTS LOT 24 & S86' SL2 OF 26 SW1/4 NE1/4 24-12-13 (2.70), FOR CONTRACTOR BAYS / RV AND BOAT STORAGE, ON LAND ZONED GC GENERAL COMMERCIAL.** Emily Bausch, City Administrator, stated the Planning Commission recommends approval and their meeting minutes and packet information is included in the Council packet. A special use permit stays with the property if the use continues between owners. Michael Jensen, City Inspector, was available to answer questions. Motion by Clark seconded by Forrest to adopt RESOLUTION NO. 26-010 by title only. ROLL CALL: Yes-Clark, Brookhouser, Kerns, Rollins, Muller, Riese, and Forrest. No-None. Absent-Hardy. Abstain-None. MOTION CARRIED.

ITEM 10 E

Council member Forrest introduced an ordinance numbered and titled as follows: Ordinance No. 2047: **AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PLATTSMOUTH, NEBRASKA TO APPROVE THE MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT AND CONTRACT EXTENSION BETWEEN THE CITY OF PLATTSMOUTH, NEBRASKA AND PLATTSMOUTH POLICE OFFICERS' ASSOCIATION, FRATERNAL ORDER OF POLICE, LODGE #34 WHICH ESTABLISHES WAGES, SALARIES AND BENEFITS; TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT, AND TO PROVIDE FOR PUBLICATION IN PAMPHLET FORM; AND TO PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE.** Steve Rathman, Plattsmouth Police Chief, was available to answer questions. Emily Bausch, City Administrator, reviewed the FOP contract negotiation process with Council. This is an extension of the existing contract, and the increases were reflected in the numbers presented during the budget workshop on August 11, 2026. Chief Rathman noted that this contract was negotiated using comparables from similar sized communities. It is important to make employment attractive to current and perspective officers since other communities are trying to pull away experienced officers with large raises and signing bonuses. Emily and Mayor Lambert are proud and thankful the Plattsmouth Police Department has made Plattsmouth one of the safest cities in Nebraska and they look forward to a continued partnership. Motion by Forrest seconded by Clark to approve the first reading of ORDINANCE NO. 2047 by title only. ROLL CALL: Yes-Muller, Riese, Forrest, Clark, Brookhouser, Kerns, and Rollins. No-None. Absent-Hardy. Abstain-None. MOTION CARRIED. Damien Wright, City Attorney, read ORDINANCE NO. 2047 into the record by title only.

Motion by Muller seconded by Brookhouser to suspend the statutory rule that ORDINANCE NO. 2047 be read on three different days and to adopt ORDINANCE NO. 2047 on final reading by title only. ROLL CALL: Yes-Brookhouser, Forrest, Rollins, Muller, Riese, Kerns, and Clark. No-None. Absent-Hardy. Abstain-None. MOTION CARRIED. Damien Wright, City Attorney, read ORDINANCE NO. 2047 into the record by title only.

ITEM 10 F

Council member Kerns introduced a resolution numbered and titled as follows: Resolution No. 26-011: **A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF PLATTSMOUTH, NEBRASKA, TO RECEIVE THE PAYOFF OF A CDBG DTR LOAN FOR PROPERTY LOCATED AT 429 MAIN STREET, PLATTSMOUTH, NEBRASKA; AND TO AUTHORIZE THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE OR REQUEST EXECUTION OF A DEED OF RECONVEYANCE AND SUCH OTHER DOCUMENTS AS MAY BE NECESSARY TO AFFECT THE FOREGOING.** Emily Bausch, City Administrator, reviewed this deed of reconveyance with Council. This was part of the 2015 CDBG Downtown Revitalization where the City offered forgivable loans if the terms of the agreements were met, most had a seven-year loan timeline. All conditions of this loan have been met. Motion by Kerns seconded by Riese to adopt RESOLUTION 26-011 by title only. ROLL CALL: Yes-Riese, Kerns, Clark, Brookhouser, Forrest, Rollins, and Muller. No-None. Absent-Hardy. Abstain-None. MOTION CARRIED. Damien Wright, City Attorney, read RESOLUTION 26-001 into the record by title only.

ITEM 10 H

Emily Bausch, City Administrator, stated that the original plans from the engineer and contractor for the water main work on 18th street reduced the road to one lane with traffic lights. With two schools near this location, it quickly became apparent that reducing lanes would not work. Church of the Holy Spirit and the City have come to an agreement allowing the creation of a temporary lane on Church property in exchange for a sidewalk being installed on the West side of the road when construction is complete. Emily said the sidewalk will benefit both schools and she is surprised there wasn't one there already. Motion by Forrest seconded by Rollins to approve an Access and Temporary Right-of-Entry Agreement with Church of the Holy Spirit located at 520 S. 18th Street, Plattsmouth, Nebraska and authorize the Mayor to execute the same. ROLL CALL: Yes-Forrest, Clark, Brookhouser, Kerns, Rollins, Muller, and Riese. No-None. Absent-Hardy. Abstain-None. MOTION CARRIED.
